Greetings Friends of the Les Cheneaux Area:

The assets of the Les Cheneaux Community Foundation have grown to over \$2 million. Many of those funds are restricted, meaning that they are designated by the donor(s) for a specific purpose. The Foundation's unrestricted assets come primarily from donations via our ANNUAL ASK, and it is from those funds that the Foundation Board uses to support the spring and fall grant cycles, in addition to other projects deemed important for the community. The ANNUAL ASK has proven to be a beneficial project for both the Community Foundation as well as the other community organizations included. This past year the contributions to the ANNUAL ASK, for all organizations, topped the \$90,000 mark. WOW!

Prioritizing the use of unrestricted funds is the Board's responsibility. Of late, they have chosen to focus on issues related directly to enhancing the local economy. That was the primary reason they supported the Aldo Leopold Festival as it met many of the community's priorities of:

- Expanding the business shoulder season (Spring and Fall)
- Turning the area's nature preserves into economic assets
- Capitalizing on the phenomenal natural beauty and other assets of the Les Cheneaux area
- Emphasizing minimal environmental impact

The 2016 Festival doubled the number of participants from our first year. We expect, given the quality of the programs provided this year, that it will continue to grow. There are additional outgrowths coming from the Aldo Leopold Festival that are in the planning stages, which we trust will economically benefit the area.

The Foundation Board's goals must mirror Community goals. Therefore, we work closely with the Clark Township Board of Trustees and other local organizations. We will be involved, in some form or another, in at least some of the 12 large local projects that are in various planning stages. One such project you will be hearing about soon is the Cedarville Harbor Project. Several community organizations are working together to bring this project into reality starting this year. Our SIP & SAIL Cruise, scheduled for July 29, will focus on providing information on the Cedarville Harbor project, as well as others. Please grab your friends and plan on joining us for a great evening.

To those of you who have supported the Foundation in the past we THANK YOU. For those of you who have not, and want or need a vehicle through which you can join forces with other community supporters, we will welcome your support.




This spring, YAC surveyed the entire high school to conduct a formal needs assessment to be used to help YAC in future program planning.
