YEAR END CONTRIBUTIONS & THE CARES ACT

The 2020 CARES Act passed by Congress has made some significant changes affecting charitable giving this year. Those changes include a new charitable deduction available to individual taxpayers that do not itemize their deductions, which allows for a charitable deduction of up to \$300 per individual. The CARES Act also waives the requirement for many IRA holders to take a minimum distribution by the end of the year.

Serving as the fiduciary agent for the local match dollars, the Foundation channeled donations from individuals and organizations to Clark Township. We also included our own contribution of \$20,000 to assure the project's completion. A TRIBUTE TO KERRI MERTAUGH



Kerri Mertaugh (1963-2020) was one of the great ambassadors for the Les Cheneaux area. Her passing this past year has left a hole in our community that will be felt for some time. Kerri's wish was for the building of the non-motorized bike path between the Hessel and Cedarville.

KICKSTART TO CAREER

Now in its third year, we currently have 40 students in K-2nd grade enrolled in Kickstart to Career, our Children's Savings Account program.

The Foundation deposits \$50 into an account for each child upon enrollment in kindergarten and will match up to \$25 of deposits made by family and friends each school year.

Through this program, children learn about saving for their future education and career. Upon graduation, the funds will be available for students continuing their education — whether trade school or college.

COVID-19 RELIEF: PROTECTING LES CHENEAUX

Thanks to the outpouring of generosity from many, the Foundation established a COVID Relief Fund that has been made available to assist individuals and businesses during this crisis. This has been used to fund:

- "Safe Start Kits" containing facemasks, sanitizing wash, signs, and other materials to 50 local businesses.
- "Les Cheneaux Loot" project of gift certificate and coupons through Les Cheneaux Chamber of Commerce which resulted in over \$10,000 of spending activity invested in our local economy.
- Supplies for the "Mackinac County Mask Making Brigade" to provide over 6,000 face masks to the community.
- Grocery store certificates to supplement school family deliveries through the end of the 2019-2020 school year.
- Musical instruments shields for school band members.





Les Cheneaux Community Foundation also made a grant to Cedar Post Food Pantry, as well as worked with volunteers from the Feeding America Food Truck brought to the Les Cheneaux Area this spring.

Even the youngest shoppers were excited to get their hands on Les Cheneaux Loot this spring and summer.
